

There are always some growing pains with change and our move to the barn was no exception. With that said there will be a few more adjustments this year to make things even better for 2024.

There have been some changes to the rules for the Junior Livestock Show. It is your responsibility to <u>READ the premium book</u>. As a participant in the show you should be familiar with the general rules and the rules for all divisions that you are participating in. If you need clarification on any rules please contact the chair of the livestock show.

### A FEW ITEMS OF NOTE

- There will be NO parking on the level this year.
- The turf across the street will serve as the parking lot for all vehicles and trailers.
- Please note that you will need a parking pass if parked in the turf after the fair opens at 4 PM.
- •No ez-up's allowed inside the building. All aisles and doors are to remain clear. No exceptions.
- All seating must remain around the showring.
- A few pens will be provided for clubs to store materials in a pen.
- Please be advised that Dairy and Dairy Goats will be showing Friday. Your animals will be eligible to be held for master showmanship Saturday. This will be determined by both Master Showmanship chairs. Pens will be provided to you.

<u>PAYMENT WITH CASH OR CHECK: All entries</u> must be paid by Wednesday night following setup to the office to be eligible to show.

<u>ADMISSION:</u> No free admission buttons will be provided this year. Admission buttons are presale only this year. Buttons will be \$20. The Button is good for the duration of the fair. Wristbands will be available for purchase for daily entry at the gate. Kids 10 and under are free.

<u>PARKING:</u> Parking passes will be available to purchase for \$20. These passes will be valid for the duration of the fair.

# **GENERAL RULES**

- Representatives from every club and Independents having animals participating in the Norco Fair are expected to assist in the organization and administration of the Norco Fair Jr. Livestock Show & Auction. This includes all work days prior to the fair and after the fair.
- 2. ALL exhibitors, clubs, and chapters must stay and clean the livestock facility before being released at the conclusion of the fair. Exhibitors must check out with the livestock office staff Sunday evening. A \$100 penalty will be taken from the exhibitor's auction check if they are not present and participating in cleanup.
- 3. The Norco Fair Jr. Livestock Auction is restricted to FFA, 4-H, Grange, and Independent members in good standing who live in or whose club is chartered in the Corona-Norco Unified School District. Grange members in good standing who reside within the Corona-Norco Unified School District. All exhibitors may sell only one market animal. All exhibitors must be enrolled in the 2024-2025 club year. All breeding classes, table decorating, home arts and educational displays are open to any FFA, 4-H, Independent or Grange member in good standing.
- FFA members may participate as members until the end of the calendar year following their graduation from high school. A graduate is eligible until December 31, 2024.
- 4-H and Grange members may exhibit in the
  calendar year in which they turn 5 years old by Dec. 31st. and can exhibit as a member until the end of the calendar year in which the member reaches 19 years of age.
- Under no circumstances may an exhibitor enter the same species of animal in FFA, 4-H, Grange and Independent. An exhibitor is allowed to change a species from one organization to the other only once in a calendar year.

  No 4-H, FFA, Grange or Independent member
- 7. may exhibit a market animal which has been sold as a market animal through any fair or junior livestock auction regardless of a change of ownership.
  - Entries must be submitted online at the link provided no later than August **16, 2024**. All
- 8. Independent members must email proof of ownership thru the Showman App. to exhibit. All exhibitors 8 and under as of 12/31/2024 are classified as independent. All independent
- 9. exhibitors must submit a birth certificate along with proof of ownership.

- 9. All Independent Exhibitors must be at least 5 years old by December 31st of the program year. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through Dec. 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age. Independent Exhibitors must provide proof of ownership for their project 30 days (July 31, 2024) prior to weigh in on all small market animals, 60 days (July 1, 2024) prior to weigh in on all large market animals and 120 days (May 2, 2024) prior to weigh in on market beef. They must present to the auction chair 3 photos of their animals with the exhibitor in each photo, front, back and side, no copies. You must turn in required paperwork to be eligible to exhibit.
- 10. There shall be no more than 2 market entries per division per exhibitor. There are limits to the number of animals that may be sold through the auction. (Refer to auction Rule #4).
- 11. Animals entered in a market division CANNOT be entered in a breeding division.
- 12.Each animal must be owned and part of a recognized project of the organization under whose supervision it is developed at least 60 days prior to exhibiting; except for market steers (class 1), where the requirement is 120 days. Large animal prospect class entries, poultry, turkeys and breeding rabbits, must be owned by the exhibitor for 30 days.
- 13.The Livestock committee reserves the right to close classes and refuse additional entries when existing facilities become exhausted. Judges and committee may combine or cancel classes.
- 14.Judges that participate at the Norco Fair cannot be related to exhibitors of the current show. Any judge that participates at the Norco Fair cannot sell market animals to exhibitors of the current show.
- 15.Animals will be accepted and weighed-in between 5:00pm and 8:00pm, Thursday, August 29th, 2024. Proof of ownership and brand inspection paperwork for all market beef due at weigh in. Each exhibitor will acknowledge reading and abiding by the code of ethics when registering for the show through the Showman Application. There will be no reweighs unless requested immediately before leaving the scale area. All market animals must be tagged (large livestock), tattooed or banded (small animal), prior to weigh in.

- 16.Exhibitors with breeding animals will be released 1hr after announcing Small Animal Masters results or at the discretion of the Master Chair. The remaining non-auction animals will be released Saturday from 10:00pm and 12:00am. Then again Sunday from 6:00am and 7:00am. Proper paperwork will be required for release of any animal by Barns and Facility Chair.
- 17.All exhibitors are responsible for the care, feeding, and watering of their animals until they are removed from the fairgrounds.
- 18.The Fair management reserves the right to remove from the ring or fairgrounds any animal found to be diseased, in poor condition, or unsound. Any mistreatment of any exhibitor's animal or exhibitor misconduct will bar him/her from further participation in the remainder of the fair and will also result in removal of the exhibitor and all his/her entries from the fair.

  19.All parents and club advisors will be responsible
  - for their children's behavior. Unruly or destructive youth will be removed from the show and their entries will be disqualified and entry fees forfeited. Any parent or advisor interfering with the judging process will be removed from the fairgrounds.
- 20.Written permission must be obtained from the Livestock Superintendent before removing any large livestock or small market animals from the fairgrounds for any reason. No animal will be allowed to leave before the scheduled time unless it is showing signs of stress, illness, injury, or has a veterinary certificate.
- 21. No one except for authorized personnel is allowed in the show ring during shows!
- 22.Exhibitors are required to keep their pens and animals clean and appealing at all times throughout the fair.
- 23.Each club, chapter & Independent will be assigned a specific task for setup and takedown. Each club or chapter will also be assigned an area to maintain during the fair. The Barns & Facilities Chairperson will assign these tasks after the entries are received.
- 24.In all breed divisions, first and second place of each section MUST compete for its respective Champion and Reserve Champion.

- 26.FFA, 4-H, Grange, and Independent members will show together in all market and breeding classes, in the appropriate age class.
- 27. Any exhibitor, who fails to show up for his class, will not be allowed to compete in an alternate class.
- 28.All market animals going through the auction will be required to remain on fairgrounds for the duration of the fair.
- 29.Protests must be submitted to the Livestock Chairman in writing and signed within 24 hours of an event. They must be accompanied by a \$50.00 filing fee. Decisions regarding application and interpretation of rules shall be made through consultation of the Livestock Superintendent, division chairperson and member's leader or advisor. If protest is valid, the member shall be ineligible for the showmanship class. If the protest proves valid, 100% of the filing fee will be returned. Ruling will be made within 24 hours of protest.
- 30.Any exhibitor parent or legal guardian found in violation of fair rules or who commits any unethical act will forfeit all awards and privileges or whatever deemed necessary by the Livestock Committee.
- 31.All rules in this premium book will be followed.

  There will be no exceptions regardless of previous actions or precedents of the Livestock Committee.
- 32. The signing of the entry form signifies that the exhibitor has read the show rules and understands and agrees to abide by them.
- 33.Feed gate will be open from 6:00am through 9:00am Friday through Sunday. Barn closes nightly at 10:00 pm.
  - 34. Absolutely NO parking in the fire lanes.
  - 35.Persons MUST be 18 years old or older to drive any motorized vehicle on the livestock level.
- 36. Parents may feed for an exhibitor if the exhibitor is at school during the morning feeding time.
- 37.All animals on the fair premises are eligible to be used for Master Showmanship.
- 38.All clubs must provide a list of all project leaders with their entries.
- 39.All exhibitors must provide an emergency contact on their entry form.

# **EXHIBITOR EXPECTATIONS**

Collectively, we are responsible for positively representing agriculture and our clubs to the community and guests who visit the show. Following the rules and codes established by our organizations and the Livestock Committee is foundational to creating a safe, friendly, and educational environment. The Livestock Committee expects all exhibitors and parents/guardians to abide by the rules and codes. Any exhibitor or parent/guardians found to be in violation will be subject to disqualification from the show, loss of awards or premiums, and/or removal from the auction.

# **Fair Preparation and Setup**

All exhibitors are required to participate in all aspects of preparation, setup, cleanup & maintaining the grounds throughout the fair.

- Clubs will need scoop shovels, push brooms, manure forks, and muck carts or wheelbarrows. Waste from cleaning pens will be deposited in the dumpsters in the trash enclosures on the east side of the barn. Do NOT put animal waste or bedding in the trash cans in the barn. Keep all areas clean and tidy: This includes but is not limited to bleachers, animal pens, wash racks, fitting areas, and club areas.
- ●Exhibitors are responsible for the care and well-being of their animal until it leaves the grounds. All animals MUST always have access to water.
- ●EZ Ups will not be allowed in or outside the barn. The exterior of the barn is a designated fire lane. Should a club want to set up an area for gathering, resting, etc., you may do so in the designated area at Nellie Weaver Hall level.
- There is NO PARKING on the barn level. Handicap and trailer parking will be available at Nellie Weaver Hall level. General parking will be across the street on the turf. Please follow the marking/pattern established by the parking subcommittee when parking. Do NOT block drive aisles. If you will be in the lot(s) after 3:00 p.m., you MUST have a parking pass displayed on your vehicle's dash.

# **Barn Duty Requirements**

All exhibitors are responsible for signing up for Barn Duty. Barn duty includes the following:

- 1.Refill all hand sanitizers
- 2.Empty trash cans and place new bags
- 3. Empty all recycling cans and place new bags
- 4.Sweep all aisles and place waste in the dumpsters outside of the barn
- 5.Clear bleachers of trash between shows.

## **Auction Rules**

- 1. The Purpose of the livestock sale is for the junior exhibitors at the Norco Jr. Livestock Auction to obtain an equitable price, and encourage FFA, 4-H, Grange, and Independent members in their projects. The Junior Livestock Sale is limited to FFA, 4-H, Grange, and Independent members in good standing, and live in and/or whose club is chartered in the Corona-Norco Unified School District.
  - The livestock judges will place all animals in order of preference at time of judging. This will
  - determine the sale order.
     Additional charges to the seller will be approximately: \$3.00 per beef for brand inspection, 4% of gross income per all market
- 3. animals for advertising and expenses. Each exhibitor will be permitted to sell only one large market animal or rabbit/poultry meat pen through the livestock auction. Exception: All division Grand and Reserve Grand Champion
- market animals beef, sheep, swine, market goat, poultry and meat rabbits must be offered for sale regardless of ownership.
   Only Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, and market ready animals will be sold.
   Any market animals not to be sold in the auction must be scratched no later than 12:00
- 5. p.m. on Saturday, August 31, 2024. If you have two animals, one must be scratched or neither may be sold!!!





- 7. All animals sold must be fed, watered and haltered or penned by the exhibitor until they are loaded.
- 8. All market species Grand and Reserve Grand
  Champion floral arrangements will be purchased by the auction committee and will be deducted from the exhibitor's auction check.
  - Exhibitors are required to write thank you notes
- 9. to their buyers. A copy of the "Disposition Sheet" will be available for the exhibitor within 20 days after the auction. This sheet will contain the price, name and address of the buyer. Buyer's thank you letter must be given to the club leader prior to receiving the auction check.
- 10.Market animals may be offered for sale only once, unless donated back to the Norco Jr. Livestock Scholarship Fund or The Go Fund Me.
- 11.All small animals sold through the Norco Junior Livestock Auction are the responsibility of the buyers. It is the buyer's obligation to make arrangements for transportation and processing. The fair and the exhibitor will not be responsible for the transportation or processing of any Turkey, Poultry Meat Pen or Rabbit Meat Pen once it is sold through the auction.



# SHOWMANSHIP Class 1

#### **SHOWMANSHIP**

Awards go to first place in all divisions. Ribbons go to first place through fifth. The showmanship order is Basic, Junior, Senior, FFA and Independent.

## **SHOWMANSHIP RULES**

- 1. Showmanship to precede all classes.
- 2.Only animals owned and fitted by the exhibitor will be eligible. Fitting includes: washing, clipping, and blocking. Assistance with fitting may be provided by another fair exhibitor.
- 3.Grange or Independent members shall show in the appropriate 4H age class.
- 4.All exhibitors are required to wear show uniform of the organization they represent.
- 5. Showmanship categories are divided as follows regardless of previous experience:
- 6.Age of exhibitor by 12/31 of the same calendar year.
- 7.In order to use an animal for showmanship it must be entered into a breed or market class.




Large animal master showmanship order of go: Basic, Junior, Senior, FFA

- 1.Large animal master showmanship includes swine, beef, dairy cattle, sheep, dairy goat and market goat.
- 2.Exhibitors must notify chairperson if they plan to participate in large animal master showmanship immediately upon winning their showmanship class.
- 3.Exhibitors must check in ringside to receive
  Contestant's number by 5:45 p.m., Saturday August 31,
  2024. Exhibitors must remain in
  Show area the entire duration of master showmanship.
- 4.Scoring and time keeping will be done by Chairperson's appointees.
- 5.Exhibitors ability to handle and show animals is of main importance, but questions may be asked at the judge's discretion. When questions are asked every attempt will be made to gear it to the specific age group.
- 6. Each rotation will be a minimum of 5 minutes.
- 7. Scoring system will be a 6 point base system. The lowest score wins.
- 8.In the event that an exhibitor wins more than one showmanship class, the exhibitor must choose one species to represent. If an exhibitor was the ONLY winner in a class they must represent that species in the Master Showmanship contest. The second place winner of any class will be eligible to replace the first place winner and on down the line until the position has been filled.

# Small Animal Master Showmanship Rachel Maryanski

Small animal master showmanship order of go: Primary, Basic, Junior, Senior and FFA

- 1.Small animal master showmanship includes rabbit, cavy, poultry, dairy goat and turkey.
- 2.Exhibitors must notify the chairperson if they plan to participate in small animal master showmanship immediately upon winning their showmanship class.
- 3.Exhibitors must check in with chairperson before the start of the show Saturday, August 31, 2024. Exhibitors must remain in show area the entire duration of master showmanship.
- 4. Scoring will be done by the chairperson's appointees (usually the judge from each division rabbit, cavy, poultry and turkey).
- 5.Scoring system will be a 4 point base System. The lowest score wins.
- 6. Each rotation will be a minimum of 5 minutes.
- 7.Exhibitors ability to handle and show animals is of main importance, but questions may be asked at the judge's discretion. When questions are asked every attempt will be made to gear it to the specific age group.
- 8.In the event that an exhibitor wins more than one showmanship class, the exhibitor must choose one species to represent. If an exhibitor was the ONLY winner in a class they must represent that species in the Master Showmanship contest. The second place winner of any class will be eligible to replace the first place winner and on down the line until the position has filled.
